

Zanzibar holds significant importance in Islamic heritage due to its rich history and cultural influence. Dating back to the 8th century, Arab traders established a strong presence on the island, shaping its culture and architecture. The Sultanate of Zanzibar became a center for Islamic culture and trade in East Africa, leaving a lasting impact on the island's traditions and way of life.

Today, Zanzibar's architecture, with its Arabic and Islamic styles, and its preservation of Islamic traditions, such as language, clothing, and cuisine, reflect its deep-rooted Islamic heritage.

In Zanzibar you will witness the vibrant Muslim culture in all corners of Zanzibar, and visit the millennial old mosques, make ziyarah to the tombs of the great Ulama of East Africa. Zanzibar's name came from the Persian word Zengibar, "the coast of black people."

Islam came to East and Central Africa through Zanzibar in 1107 by Shirazi people and the mosque from the year 1108 is still in use.

The capital of this heavenly island which is located 30 kilometers east of Tanzania is Stone Town. It's on the UNESCO World Heritage list and has come until today almost untouched.

In Stone Town which has labyrinth-like narrow streets adorned with peeled-away colored stone houses, the influence of Arab culture is intense. What is indispensable for the stone houses that gave the town its name are carved wooden doors. The doors that blend with the world's famous Indian, Arab and African cultures and differ according to the ethnic origin of the inhabitants, make you feel like you are on a beautiful canvas.

The allure of Zanzibar's spices sparked a cultural melting pot, influencing not only the island's cuisine but also its architecture and traditions.

- 7. Day Participate in the traditional Dua (prayer) for safe travels in the village and a farewell dinner beneath the starlit sky, after the last day of educational sessions.

Low-cut T-shirt

We have certain clothing requirements that are suitable for the community we live in on our campus. We expect both male and female volunteers on campus and in the sea to have their chest and shoulder areas covered, and not to wear low-cut dresses, leggings or tight-fitting or transparent clothes. Our pool is built to teach swimming to local children. Therefore, it is quite shallow for adults. We can say that our children enjoy using the pool, while adults prefer the ocean more. Due to hygiene concerns, daily clothes are not allowed in our pool area, apart from swimming attire that complies with our dress code.

TERM AND CONDITIONS

- Trips that do not reach sufficient confirmed registrations may be canceled by our company at least 10 days before the tour.
- In case of cancellation due to insufficient numbers, the amount paid will be refunded to the participant without any deductions.
- The application form on our website is for pre-registration purposes only. To complete the registration, 30% of the tour fee must be paid.
- Cancellations made 30-20 days before the start of the trip will receive a full refund. Cancellations made 20-15 days before will incur a 30% deduction. Cancellations made 15-10 days before will incur a 50% deduction.
- Cancellations cannot be made and refunds cannot be issued if there are less than 10 days left before the trip. For the participant or their immediate family members; force majeure cases stated in the laws, severe accidents that prevent participation, serious illnesses requiring treatment, death cases are considered force majeure.
- The participant must prove the existence of force majeure with a valid document from official institutions. In this case, except for non-refundable amounts, the paid amount will be refunded without any deductions.

FAQ

- Zanzibar applies Visa on arrival for 50 USD, you can easily get it at the airport.
- In Zanzibar, there are no security-related issues.
- We advise you to disconnect from the rest of the world and concentrate on your adventure.
- Zanzibar is not so hot, between 25-35 C mostly.
- In times of illness or emergencies, we are very close to accessible healthcare facilities. In our village, we have a healthcare centre with a doctor and a pharmacy, and there is also a hospital located about 15 minutes away by car in our district.
- We dress modestly on our campus.
 Which means your knees, shoulders and belly should be covered.
- We wash our laundry in our designated area. If you need detergent, you can wash your clothes yourself or request assistance from our employees for a fee of \$5.
- One of the important aspects we value greatly is the interaction between our guests and volunteers with the local community. Most of our guests and volunteers prefer to bring gifts with them and distribute them in the village. However, we should mention that we have certain principles in this regard. We prefer to distribute gifts individually rather than in a collective manner, and we also emphasise not to take photos or videos of individuals without their consent to respect their privacy.
